- 5. For families that will nurture the call of God; for the spiritual and physical well-being of all parishioners; for those facing pain and agony; and for all the faithful departed. Lord, have mercy
- 6. For God's protection for all of God's children, for the health and safety of everyone during this time of the COVID-19 pandemic, we pray to the Lord.
- 7. For continuous coordinated efforts among individuals, nations and societies as we all work together to prevent further spread of the coronavirus, we pray to the Lord.
- 8. For healthcare workers and all who are on the front-lines, especially those in positions of vulnerability as they work to serve their neighbors, we pray to the Lord.
- 9. That in addition to following all the recommendations of the healthcare professionals, we also remember to appeal to God in prayer, we pray to the Lord.
- 10. For those are sick and suffering, especially for those who are isolated and without help, for their healing, we pray to the Lord.
- 11. For those who have died, for eternal rest for their souls, and for peace and comfort for those they left behind, we pray to the Lord.
- 12. For all those who suffer from anxiety in the midst of this exceptional situation we are going through. May they get comfort, Lord, both in your unlimited Love and in the community. Holy Spirit, be our light so that we keep faith in the heart of our daily lives and in that way, we may transform fear into hope. Amen.
