

COMMUNIQUÉ No. 49 – NOVEMBER 19, 2021 INFORMATION

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Good morning!

As promised, here are the new guidelines and measures in effect from November 15 as approved by Archbishop Christian Lépine concerning the rental of places of worship in pastoral settings and activities held in them:

RENTAL OF ROOMS IN PLACES OF WORSHIP

Health guidelines to be followed according to the nature of the activity to be held in the rented space;

1) Rental for a religious activity

- Number: maximum of 250 persons if passport is not required; over 250 persons if vaccination passport is required
- Physical distancing: one (1) metre if passport is not required; no minimum physical distancing required if vaccination passport is required
- Masks: mandatory at all times, except while eating or drinking
- For all worship activities, those in charge will decide whether or not to require the vaccination passport:

Scenario A - Vaccine passport required

- No physical distancing,
- No maximum capacity,
- Standing permitted,
- Masks to be worn at all times, except while eating or drinking.

Scenario B - Vaccine passport not required

- Physical distancing of one (1) metre,
- Maximum of 250 participants indoors (500 outdoors),

- Standing permitted,
- ATTENTION! NEW REQUIREMENT (most recent instructions issued by Public Health): Masks
 are to be worn at all times when indoors, except while drinking or eating. It is therefore no
 longer permitted to remove masks in our congregations, even when seated.

*Note regarding choirs, as mentioned in VG Communiqué no. 48:

With respect to choirs, at all Masses, whether requiring passports or not, once the choir member's has removed their mask, precautionary measures must be taken: the distance separating singers from one another and from any other musicians must be at least two (2) metres. Smaller vocal groups (mini-choirs) are to be preferred. Remember that the congregation may sing, but masks must be worn throughout.

2) Weddings

At the reception or banquet that customarily follows the wedding ceremony:

• Number: maximum of 25 persons

Physical distancing: one (1) metre

Masks: mandatory throughout

3) Funerals

At the reception following the funeral, guidelines applicable to private activities in a public place are in effect:

Number: maximum of 25 persons

• Physical distanceing one (1) metre

Masks: mandatory throughout

4) Rental of rooms for Christmas and New Year's parties and receptions

Guidelines applicable to private activities in a public place are in effect:

Number: maximum of 25 persons

Physical distancing: one (1) metre

Masks: mandatory throughout

5) Rental of space for shows/entertainment, Christmas concerts and other cultural activities

Health guidelines applicable to Events and Shows are in effect, as follows:

- Vaccination passport is required;
- Number: no maximum capacity is set; sections are not required to be separated;
- Masks: must be worn at all times when indoors, except while eating or drinking;
- Standing and dancing are permitted;
- All additional regular protocols must be followed: application for permits or any other authorizations required by the municipality.

6) Rental to a community organization

- Workshops and support group meetings (e.g. Alcoholics Anonymous) may be held;
- Number: maximum of 250 persons, provided that all remain seated;
- Physical distancing: one empty seat separating each participant from neighbours;
- Additional health guidelines to be followed: masks, washing or sanitizing hands, etc.
