Celebrating Our Volunteers!


We all know that the work of the Church in Montreal could not continue without the faithful work of volunteers like yourself. We thought you might be interested in learning more about the profile of SASMAD volunteers from our 2019 statistics:

In all sectors, the vast majority of SASMAD volunteers are women. The total average is 77% women and 23% men. The average age of volunteers, across all sectors, is 67.8 years. The majority of volunteers are from cultural communities (54%). 17% of SASMAD volunteers are from Africa, 13% from Latin America, 11% from the Caribbean, 7% from Europe and 6% from Asia. The Central region has the highest proportion of SASMAD volunteers who are women religious, 40 in all, across the sectors. 70% of SASMAD volunteers are retired.

The majority of SASMAD volunteers, about 75%, speak two or three languages.

What a generous and diverse group we are! We are so grateful for all that you do and all that you are!

On May Day each year, we reflect on the needs of workers globally. This year we pray particularly for the needs of front-line workers, health care staff and those who work in seniors' residences. We also think of all those who are without work, and those whose work has significantly shifted throughout the pandemic.
